

The official language of the Symposium will be English and experts will evaluate posters and talks to offer professional feedback. As a main difference from other meetings, this Symposium will cover a wide range of research topics and encourage every PhD student to present his/her project in a more general manner in order to reach an interdisciplinary audience.

## Requirements of the Presentations

In order to present a poster or talk, it is not essential to have outstanding results. We also support presentations of new methods and interesting techniques related to the project.

Oral presentations shall be kept quite general and will be restricted to 12 minutes, followed by 3 minutes of discussion. The poster size has to be DIN A0 format (841 mm x 1189 mm) and the poster presentation should be limited to 5 minutes. ## Expert Feedback

The main difference from other meetings will be the evaluation of every oral and poster presentation.
